Throughout the life time of your guide dog puppy, we will keep you informed of their progress and the impact they make. Throughout this unique experience you will receive the following:

Name your puppy – CMB Engineering will provide a boy's name and a girl's name (or unisex) for the puppy. The name will be approved by our breeding team based at our Breeding Centre.

Special visit – Whilst you are waiting you will receive a special visit from one of our guide dog owners and/or puppy walkers. They will explain about our life changing work and you will meet your first guide dog.

Optional visit to National Breeding Centre near Learnington Spa

Meet your puppy – when the pup is 6-8 week's old, you will receive a birth certificate and photograph. You will also get a VIP (very important puppy) visit from your pup, when they are over 17 weeks old.

Learn about your puppy – receive 3 pup-dates detailing the pup's progress and 2 report cards from the puppy walker, so you know how well your puppy is getting on with their training.

Learn about training – receive 2 training updates once the pup enters the training school. Visit the training school for a tour and meet your pup once again during their training. Receive a framed photograph of the dog in their white working harness.

It's a match – Your pup will be matched to a guide dog owner and start their partnership. Receive 2 report cards over the first two years, finding out the difference your special pup has made to someone's life. Someone just like Sian.
